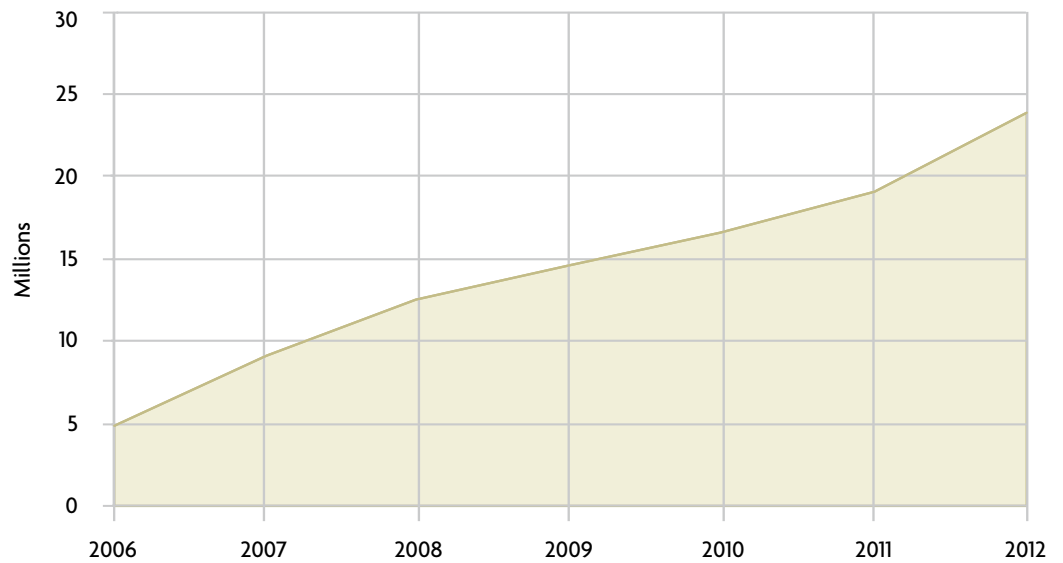

Publisher Participation

More than 2,600 e-journals, more than 53,400 e-books, and 15 d-collections have been committed to the archive this year. In total, 176 publishers on behalf of more than 2,000 societies and associations are participating as of December 31, 2012, with 36 publishers joining this year.

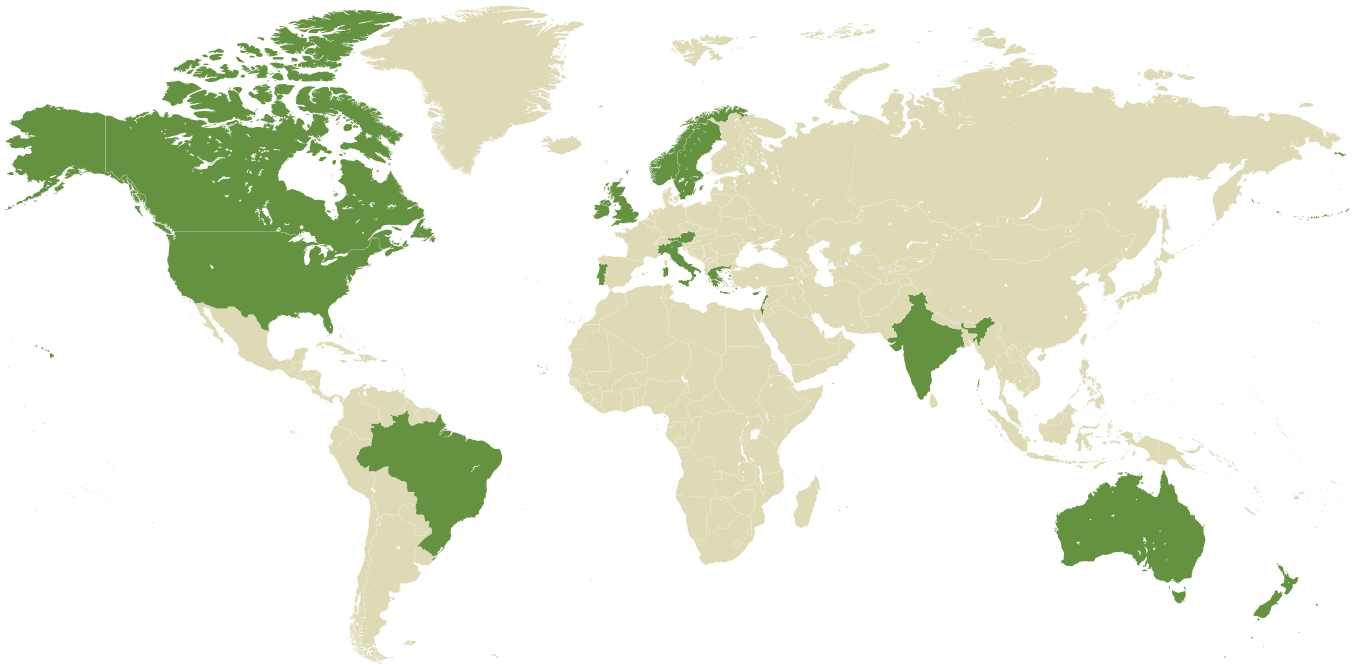
Number of digital items preserved*

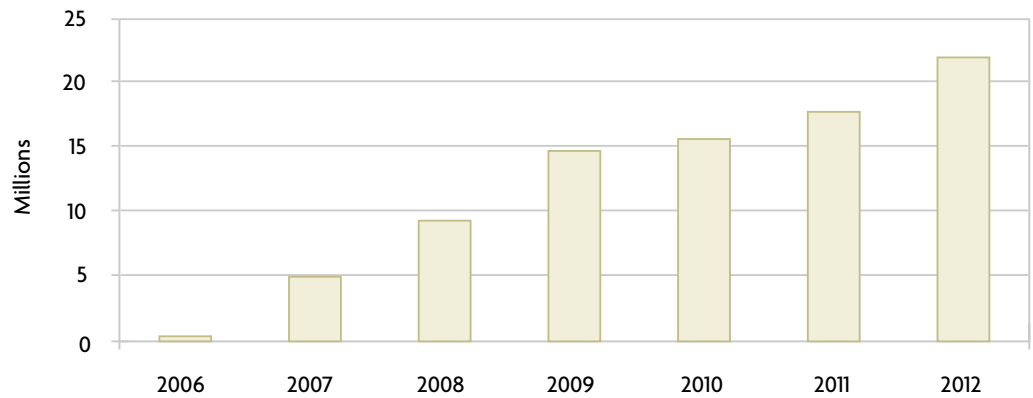

Content Ingest Activity

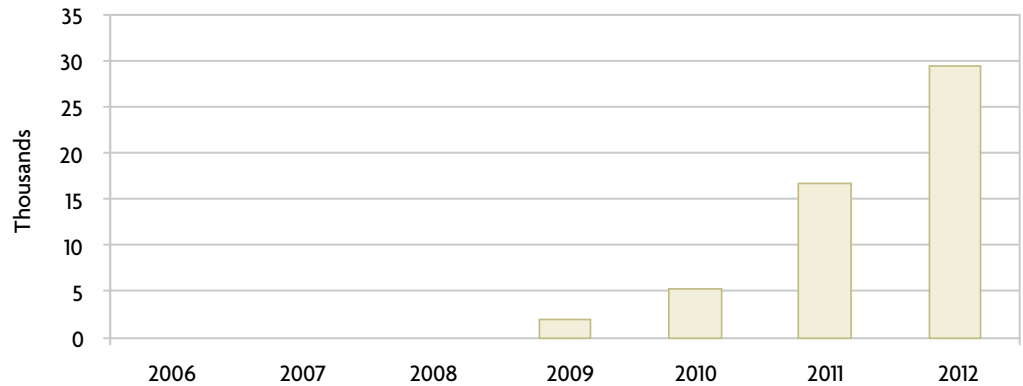
The Portico Archive continues to see significant growth each year; this year we ingested more than 4.3 million new articles to our E-Journals Service, 12,500 new e-books to our E-Books Service, and 16,500 digitized books and newspaper issues to our D-Collections Service.

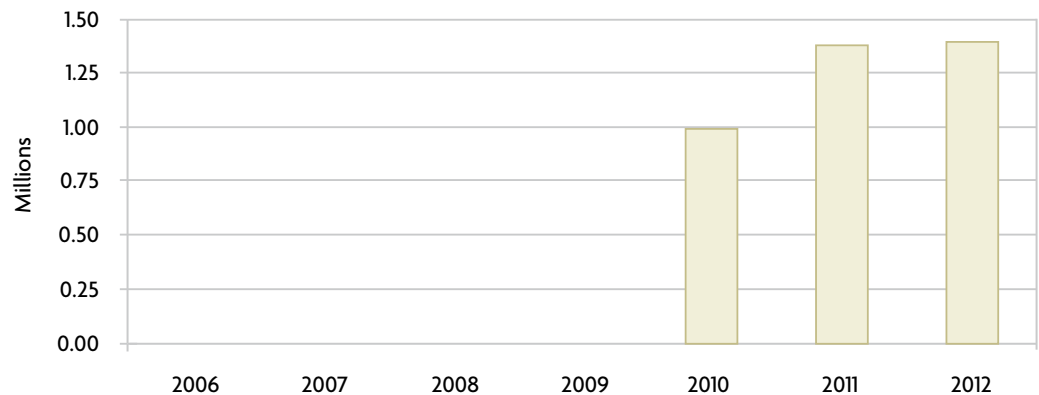

Trigger Events

Portico experienced two trigger events this year. E-Journal Service participants, regardless of whether your institution previously subscribed, now have access to “Australian and New Zealand Journal of Audiology” and “European Journal of Morphology.”

Post-Cancellation Access Activity

The amount of content available for use at participating institutions through post-cancellation access claims has increased significantly since the first claim in 2009. Currently, Portico is providing 198 institutions with access to more than 500,000 articles and books.

Holdings Comparison

Publisher Changes

As you work to manage your collections, there are some publisher changes you may want to be aware of:

- Australian Academic Press's journals were acquired by Cambridge University Press (CUP) in February 2012; Portico is now receiving the 19 titles committed to the archive through our agreement with CUP
- American Geophysical Union (AGU) has entered into a publishing partnership with Wiley-Blackwell; the titles formerly supplied to Portico by AGU will be committed through our relationship with Wiley-Blackwell
- Royal Society of Medicine's journal program has been acquired by Sage; Portico is now receiving the 28 titles committed to the archive through our agreement with Sage
