


Number of digital items preserved*






Content Ingest Activity

The Portico archive continues to see significant growth each year; this year we ingested more than 6 million new articles to our E-journal Service, 135,000 new books to our E-book Service, and 75,000 digitized books, newspaper issues, and documents to our D-collection Service.

Post-Cancellation Access Activity

The amount of content available for use at participating institutions through post-cancellation access claims has increased significantly since the first claim in 2009. Currently Portico is providing 206 institutions with access to more than 500,000 articles and books.

Holdings Comparison

Audit Site Changes

Based upon the recommendations provided by librarians and publishers in 2013, we will be revising the Portico audit interface by early spring 2014. These changes will include browsing by year, volume, and issue within journals and by book title within books. The new audit interface will make it easier for librarians and publishers to view the PDF and HTML versions of items while still allowing access to more archival information about the items. The new audit interface will also provide more detailed information on what issues are preserved and what are missing from the archive.
